**Our Itinerary - Commencing on September 7, 2012**

**DAY 1 (Friday) SANTIAGO**

Arrive in Santiago (you are welcome to make your own arrangements or to have our partner travel agent book your preferred flights) and transfer to the **W Hotel** (*N.B. Click on the name of the hotel and on all similarly highlighted links to open the corresponding webpage*), located



in the heart of the city's most diverse, culturally rich and upscale district, and only doors away from sensational shopping and the captivating city life synonymous with Santiago. After settling in we set off on a sightseeing tour of the city so that you can get your bearings and appreciate the history and charm of Santiago. Founded in



1541, against the backdrop of the spectacular Andes mountains, Santiago has been able to mix the old and the new, with many of the colonial buildings surviving to this day. From the city centre we cross the Mapocho River and drive to the top of Cerro San Cristóbal, from where we will have one of the best panoramic views over the city and the snow-capped Andes. The remainder of the afternoon is yours to do with as you wish. In the evening, José and Leona invite you for a welcome cocktail, before we all embark on our exploration of Santiago's restaurants and, for those with stamina, nightlife scene. [*Inclusions: Overnight. Welcome Reception.*]

**DAY 2 (Saturday) SANTIAGO**

We have all morning at leisure, so you can choose to relax, explore the many sights of Santiago, shop or whatever else takes your fancy. In the afternoon we depart our hotel for a gentle 90-minute walking tour of the restored district of Lastarria, which is filled



with artists selling their works of art, a wide selection of charming cafes and restaurants, and hosts a flea market on most Saturdays (*which is today!*). The tour continues with a visit to one of the most

exclusive gastronomic neighbourhoods in Santiago, the area of Isidora Goyenechea. Afterwards, we move on to the Nueva Costanera/Borde Rio area for a sampling of Chilean wines, before transferring back to our hotel. This evening we offer you the choice of making your own dinner arrangements at one of Santiago's many restaurants, quite a few of which you will have seen during your afternoon walk or, for those who select the 'Gourmet' option on the tour (*refer to the details at the end of this itinerary*), dining at one of Santiago's premier restaurants, **Europeo**. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B. D/optional.*]



### DAY 3 (Sunday) SANTIAGO / LIMA / CUZCO

Having adjusted to South American time and pace, this morning we transfer to the airport for our flight to mystical Cuzco, via



Lima. On arrival we will be met and transferred to our hotel in the Sacred Valley of the Incas, a region filled with incomparable Inca ruins, stunning Andean mountain vistas, charming towns and plenty of opportunities to get out and enjoy the countryside. Our 'refuge' for the next three nights is the **Hotel Rio Sagrado**, a beautiful Orient-Express hotel built in natural materials to resemble an authentic Andean village and set on the banks of the



rushing Urubamba River, among verdant fields and towering mountains. Situated at a lower altitude than nearby Cuzco, its delightful hotel villas provide the perfect environment in which to relax and acclimatize, and serve as an ideal base from which to explore the valley's attractions. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]

### DAY 4 (Monday) SACRED VALLEY OF THE INCAS

A full day's tour of the Sacred Valley of the Incas awaits us today. Our excursion will continue our familiarization of the valley and



will take us to the Pisac Markets, where we will have a chance to experience the vibrant and colourful atmosphere of a traditional marketplace, and later in the afternoon, the impressive ruins of Ollantaytambo. The valley is fed by numerous rivers that descend through adjoining valleys and gorges. Ancient ruins, gentle mountain slopes and scattered farming towns surrounded by patchwork fields define the valley, which was appreciated by the Incas due to its special geographical and climatic qualities. It was one of the empire's main



points for the extraction of natural wealth and the best place for maize production in Peru. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B. L.*]

### DAY 5 (Tuesday) SACRED VALLEY OF THE INCAS

Another full day tour lies ahead today. This one taking us to the village of Chinchero, the Moray archaeological ruins and the salt

terraces of Maras. Chinchero, also known as the "City of the Rainbow", is located midway between the highlands and valley floor, and surrounded by the snow-clad mountains of Salkantay, Veronica and Soray. Chinchero's citizens maintain a traditional Andean lifestyle, dressing in multicoloured traditional styled clothes, only speaking the Quechua language and still keeping many of their age-old customs. During our visit, we will be shown some of the ancient techniques that have been passed from generation to generation. Our tour continues to Moray, famous for its embedded amphitheatre formed by four circular terraces which seem to disappear into the interior of the *puna*, like an artificial crater. Evidence seems to suggest that Moray



was an important centre of Inca agriculture, where research was conducted on crops grown on different sized plots and at various altitudes. The irrigated fertile soil was experimented on with more than 250 different types of vegetables, cereals like corn, quinoa and kiwicha. From here we offer the more energetic travellers an optional 6km walk along ancient paths down to the charming village of Maras. At the end of the tour we will transfer back to our hotel, for a well-earned rest. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B. L.*]

### DAY 6 (Wednesday) SACRED VALLEY / MACHU PICCHU

This morning we transfer to the train station in Ollantaytambo for a 90-minute 'Vistadome' train ride to the deserted and inspiring city of Machu Picchu, the most renowned example of Inca architecture. Today's visit to magical Machu Picchu will undoubtedly be one of the highlights of our trip! On arrival, hotel staff will collect our bags and take them to our hotel, the **Sumaq Machu Picchu Hotel**, the only five-star hotel in Aguas Calientes that is architecturally inspired by the enigmatic lost city of the Incas. A mini-bus will take us to the ruins for a guided visit of the Machu Picchu Citadel accompanied by a certified guide. Our exploration of the enigmatic city will last about 3 hours, including an explanation of the history and mystery of the ruins and with lunch served at the Sanctuary Lodge. At the conclusion, a mini-bus will take us back down the mountain and to our hotel. In the evening, we will dine in the hotel's restaurant from a menu inspired by regional ingredients and will begin to understand why Peruvian cuisine is widely considered one of the most diverse and interesting in the world. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B. L. D.*]



### DAY 7 (Thursday) MACHU PICCHU / CUZCO

This morning we board our mini bus for a second visit to the ruins, before the large non-Aguas Calientes-based crowds start to arrive. This head start will allow us a privileged, more contemplative encounter with the spirits of the ruins. Weather permitting, we will be able to watch the mist rise over the top of the mountain citadel and to explore the ruins at our own pace, before returning to Aguas Calientes in the afternoon. For the more energetic, there is also the option of climbing to Huayna Picchu, but anyone interested is advised to start early! The path to Huayna Picchu, the Younger or Lesser Peak, rises nearly 400 metres above the main plaza of Machu Picchu and departs from the Sacred Rock area, taking approximately an hour at a leisurely pace to reach the summit. The



climb passes through small caverns carved from the rocky walls, and miniature terraces, scattered about and split off from the trail. Once at the top of Huayna Picchu, you are rewarded with a sweeping panorama that takes in the entirety of Machu Picchu, the Urubamba River & Canyon below and the astonishing sparkingly snow-capped peaks of the high Andes along the distant south-eastern horizons back towards Cuzco. In the afternoon we take a mini-bus back to the train station to join the train back to Ollantaytambo. On arrival, we will be met and transferred the rest of the way by road to our hotel in Cuzco, the **Hotel Monasterio**. Located high in the Andes, some 3,400 metres above sea level, the historic city of Cuzco is famed for its unique blend of Spanish and Inca cultures. Our hotel is located right beside the lively Cuzco central square and is a former monastery and national monument dating from 1592. The hotel combines its centuries-old charm and ambience with luxury hotel service, inspired restaurants and boutique rooms and suites, and is the ideal base from which to discover the delights of Cuzco, a mystical town filled with a vibrant scene of old and modern architecture, markets, galleries and restaurants serving 'new Andean' cuisine. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]



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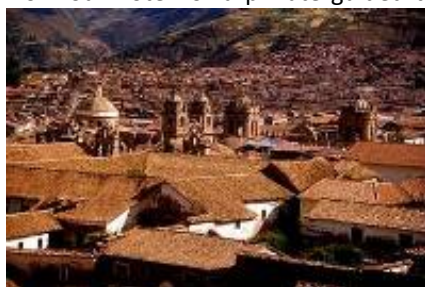


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### DAY 8 (Friday) CUZCO

The morning is at leisure so that you can do whatever takes your fancy. In a city such as Cuzco, one is never short of inspiration. In the afternoon we will be collected from our hotel for a private guided tour throughout the city, commencing with a visit to the Cathedral, which is located next to the main plaza and houses the city's greatest repertoires of colonial art. Our next stop is the famous Koricancha, formerly the Inca Empire's richest temple, which subsequently became a catholic church. Afterwards we visit Cuzco's main ruins on the outskirts of the city. Sacsayhuamán, which in Quechua means



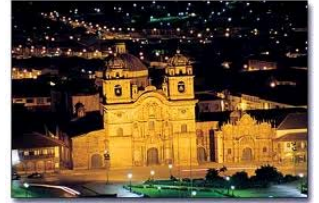
Sacsayhuamán, which in Quechua means



“satisfied falcon”, is thought to be of religious and military significance and is the most impressive ruin next to Cuzco. This evening we offer you the choice of making your own dinner arrangements or, for those who select the ‘Gourmet’ option on the tour (*refer to the details at the end of this itinerary*), dining at one of Cuzco’s leading restaurants, **Cicciolina**. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B. D/optional.*]

### DAY 9 (Saturday) CUZCO

Experience has taught us that Cuzco casts a spell over all its visitors and hence we have allowed for another day at leisure, so that you can relax or explore to our heart’s content. Walking the streets of the city is a rewarding experience and one option worth undertaking is a stroll up to the artisan’s district of San Blas to visit the pretty adobe *Iglesia San Blas* and explore some of the handicraft workshops nearby. Despite its simple exterior San Blas Church contains one of the most impressive colonial jewels in the country - an intricately carved 17th-century cedar pulpit hewn from a single tree trunk and dominated by the triumphant figure of Christ. Being in Cuzco, with time on your hands and the opportunity to take in the local ambience will be one of the highlights of the tour. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]



### DAY 10 (Sunday) CUZCO / LIMA

This morning we transfer to the airport for our flight to Lima, the ancient capital of the Spanish empire in South America. On arrival we will be transferred to our hotel, the **Miraflores Park Hotel**, located in one of Lima’s most



fashionable areas and offering spectacular views over the ocean. The afternoon is at leisure for you to relax or explore to your heart’s content. In the evening we will dine at the **Huaca Pucllana Restaurant**. Constructed in the fifth century by the inhabitants of the Lima Valley, Huaca Pucllana was both an



important religious and ceremonial site and administrative centre. Today the ruins are spread over fifteen hectares and at night are beautifully lit to create an ambient setting for our dinner that features creative Peruvian cuisine, which features a combination of fusion and classic *criollo* cooking. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B. D.*]

### DAY 11 (Monday) LIMA

After a morning of leisure, during which you can set your own agenda (for which we will happily provide a range of options), our afternoon contains a private guided tour of the city, including a trip to the Larco Herrera Museum. Our tour includes the city’s most important monuments: The Plaza Mayor, Government Palace, the City Hall and the Cathedral, as well as Torre Tagle, an exceptionally beautiful mansion built in 1735, which today houses the offices of the Foreign Affairs Ministry. Also on our



itinerary is the recently renovated Palacio de Osambela, built between 1803 and 1805, and now serving as a venue for art exhibitions and cultural events. The Larco Museum has the most important archaeological collection on the north coast of Peru and is located in an old Vice Regal mansion that was constructed on a pre-Colombian pyramid from the 18<sup>th</sup> century.



This fabulous museum also has an exquisite collection of gold and silver of ancient Peru and a room full of erotic art. This evening we offer you the choice of making your own dinner arrangements or, for those who select the ‘Gourmet’ option on the tour (*refer to the details at the end of this itinerary*), dining at one of Peru and the world’s leading restaurants, **Astrid y Gaston**, (ranked in the S.Pellegrino World’s 50 Best Restaurants of 2011). [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]

### DAY 12 (Tuesday) LIMA / SAO PAULO / RIO DE JANEIRO

Today is the day for a change of pace and culture, so we transfer to the airport for a flight to Rio de Janeiro, via Sao Paulo. On arrival we will be transferred to our hotel, the **Porto Bay International**, located along the famous Copacabana Beach. What a reward for the day’s journey! [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]



### DAY 13 (Wednesday) RIO DE JANEIRO

This morning we embark on a private full day tour of Rio de Janeiro, commencing with a drive along the Rodrigo de Freitas Lagoon to the station from which we will ride the scenic cog railway to the base of the 125-foot tall statue of Christ the Redeemer on Corcovado Mountain. The train ride takes 20 minutes and offers a wonderful chance to experience the lush tropical vegetation of the Tijuca Forest, before arriving at the top of Corcovado and marveling at the breathtaking view. From there we head to a traditional Brazilian 'churrascaria' restaurant for a magnificent barbecue lunch that showcases the quality and variety of Brazil's produce. After lunch, we continue the tour driving through Rio's downtown and passing by many traditional and historical sites. This afternoon's highlight will



be the cable car ride to the top of Sugar Loaf Mountain for a 360 degree view of Rio including Guanabara Bay & its famous beaches. We continue in downtown Rio for a visit to the City

Palace, Candelaria Church, Saint Sebastian Cathedral, Lapa Arches, Municipal Theatre, National Library, Fine Arts Museum, and the Sambadrome, site of Rio's famous Carnival parade. This evening we offer you the choice of making your own dinner arrangements or, for those who select the 'Gourmet' option on the tour (*refer to the details at the end of this itinerary*), dining at one of Rio's premier restaurants, **Antiquarius**, which enjoys an outstanding reputation for showcasing the best of Portuguese cuisine with Brazilian touches. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B. L. D/optional.*]



### DAY 14 (Thursday) RIO DE JANEIRO

Rio is one of the great cities of the world, so today we offer you another day at leisure, to relax, explore or to do whatever else takes your fancy. Consider a trip to the beautiful Botanic



Gardens, a tour through the surrounding forest and spectacular peak of Pedra de Gavea or a boat trip across Guanabara Bay to the Museum of Modern Art in Niteroi. The Museum of Modern Art was designed by Brazilian architect, Oscar Niemeyer, who was responsible for many of the county's greatest architectural achievements, including many of the capital Brasilia's public



buildings. The building flies from a rock, giving a beautiful view of the Guanabara Bay and the city of Rio de Janeiro. Critics of the museum say the building is so exotic that it upstages the works of art inside it. Or just sit back and watch the world go by on one of Rio's famous beaches. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]

### DAY 15 (Friday) RIO DE JANEIRO / IGUAÇU FALLS

This morning we transfer to the airport for our flight to Foz do Iguaçu, where on arrival we will be taken for a tour of the Brazilian side of the magnificent Iguaçu Falls. We walk along the paths inside the park and see the imposing Bozzeti Falls across



the border. The path continues to the spectacular lookout over the Garganta del Diablo, or Devil's Throat Falls, just 150m away. At the end of the path, you have the option of boarding a panoramic elevator for an even greater view of the surrounding scenery. At the conclusion of the tour we will be transferred across the border to our hotel, the **Loi Suites Iguaçu**, a luxury hotel set in the Iryapú Jungle on the banks of the Iguaçu River and surrounded by a spectacular landscape. This breathtaking hotel was built



with extreme respect for nature, preserving native trees and most of the jungle. You will have the rest of the day to enjoy the hotels facilities, such as the pool, the spa or gardens. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]

### DAY 16 (Saturday) IGUAÇU FALLS

Depart this morning on a private half day tour of the Argentine side of falls. We will walk along the upper and lower trails of the Iguaçu National Park to get a closer look at some of the falls that drop from the Iguaçu River and enjoy the fantastic wildlife and jungle that surrounds it. Then we will join the Great Adventure Tour travelling by truck through the Argentine National Park, following the Jacaratia path to reach Puerto Macuco, where we



will board a speedboat to navigate 5 miles on the lower Iguazu River to see the rapids close up. The boat stops short of the entry into the Devil's Throat Canyon and will also approach two waterfalls around San Martin Island which will cover us in showers. *Be prepared to get wet.* At the end of the boat trip, we will walk back up into the Park to visit the Devil's Throat Lookout and then travel by train to Puerto Canoas from where we walk along a "foot bridge" over the river to the viewing platform at Devil's Throat. Every location provides a unique perspective of these magnificent falls and their scope is such that they easily warrant all of the attention that we are bestowing upon them. At the conclusion of the tour we return to our hotel, with the evening at leisure. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]



### DAY17 (Sunday) IGUAÇU FALLS / BUENOS AIRES

The morning is at leisure to relax and enjoy the hotel facilities, before transferring to the airport for our flight to our final destination, sensual and romantic Buenos Aires. Our final abode on this journey will be the **Loi Suites Recoleta**, a luxury hotel that stands in the heart of the elegant neighbourhood of Recoleta. The famous Recoleta Cemetery is located around the corner of this beautiful hotel, the shops that line Patio Bullrich are 4 blocks away and the Colon Theatre is only a 15 minute walk away from this property. This afternoon we depart for a private wine tasting session, exploring the grape varieties and vineyards that have made Argentina one of the world's leading producers. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B.*]



### DAY 18 (Monday) BUENOS AIRES

This morning we will set out for a half day private tour of the city. Buenos Aires is located on the southern shore of the Río de la Plata. Strongly influenced by European culture, Buenos Aires is sometimes referred to as the 'Paris of the South' or 'Paris of South America.' The tour takes in the most important monuments and sights of the city, including Plaza 25 de Mayo, Government House (La Casa Rosa) and City Hall, the eclectic neighbourhood of La Boca and the portside district of Puerto Madero. Our tour concludes in Recoleta, with a guided tour of the famous Recoleta Cemetery. This evening we set out for dinner and a Tango Show at Esquina Carlos Gardel. The restaurant/theatre features an exquisitely decorated Art Nouveau-style ambience that re-creates the sophistication of the most luxurious old-time dining rooms in a mystical atmosphere that will lead you to experience an unforgettable night. [*Inclusions: Overnight. B. D.*]



### DAY 19 (Tuesday) BUENOS AIRES

There are few better shopping destinations than Buenos Aires and if your preference is for clothes, leather jackets and handbags, not to mention shoes and much more, then you are likely to think that you have gone to heaven.
